#### Crnamental Characteristics

Size: Tree > 30 feet

Height: 50' - 60' (spread 20' - 30')

Leaves: Deciduous

Shape: pyramidal - oval

Ornamental Other: prefers deep, fertile soils

#### **Environmental Characteristics**

Light: Full sun, Part shade

Hardy To Zone: 3b

Soil Ph: Can tolerate acid to neutral soil (pH 5.0 to 7.4)

Environmental Other: bronze/bright green new foliage matures to dark green, then turns yellow to red in fall; mature bark is gray-black and scaly; white flowers in May; edible berries (red - black) used

in wine and jelly

#### Insect Disease

not seriously affected by disease - one of the most trouble-free cherries; wood is brittle and subject to breakage
