Cultivar Name	Notos
Cultivar Name	Notes
Alba	'Alba' - single white blooms; extended bloom period; develops good orange- red fall color; ample fruit production
Alboplena	'Alboplena' (a.k.a. var. albo-plena) - double white blooms; resistant to leaf diseases; produces no hips (fruit)
Blanc Double de Coubert	'Blanc Double de Coubert' - semi-double blooms; healthy disease-resistant foliage; yellow fall color; forms little or no fruit; may need rejuvenative pruning to correct legginess
Frau Dagmar Hastrup	'Frau Dagmar Hastrup' (a.k.a. 'Frau Dagmar Hartopp') - dense, compact form; profuse amounts of single pink blooms; large, early, persistent hips; grows to 4' tall; unsurpassed disease resistance
F.J. Grootendorst	'F.J. Grootendorst' - double, pink-red blooms; not reccommended due to significant disease issues
Grootendorst Pink	'Grootendorst Pink' (a.k.a. 'Pink Grootendorst') - dwarf form; not recommended due to disease problems; clustered small, double pink blooms; grows to 3' tall; repeat flowering and less fruit production than other forms
Hansa	'Hansa' - semi-double purple-red, fragrant flowers; orange-red hips; disease- resistant foliage; good fall color; may become leggy; grow to 6' tall
Jens Munk	'Jens Munk' - semi-double pink blooms with a yellow center; flowers are less fragrant; sparse fruiting; grows to 4' tall and wide
Therese Bugnet	'Therese Bugnet' - a hybrid; double pink, fragrant bloom; produces little or no fruit; slightly susceptible to leaf diseases; grows to 6' tall; attractive red canes in winter, stems are prone to attack by a girdling insect
Topaz Jewel	'Topaz Jewel' - double yellow blooms over an extended period; resistant to leaf diseases; grows to 5' tall and wider; seldom fruits
Agnes	'Agnes' - fragrant pale lemony-apricot blooms

Cultivar Name	Notes
Foxi Pavement	'Foxi Pavement' (aka: Buffalo Gal, Foxi, Foxy Pavement, Luberon) - deep pink, fragrant blooms; improvement on Frau Dagmar Hastrup; suitable for tough conditions; dark red rose hips; grows to 4', disease resistant, repeat bloomer
Pierette Pavement	'Pierette Pavement' - spreading habit; hybrid; semi-double, dark pink, repeat bloomer; grows to 2.5'
Purple Pavement	Purple Pavement - hybrid; semi-double blooms; purple red with a yellow heart; dark red hips; repeat bloomer
Showy Pavement	'Showy Pavement' (aka: Pink Pavement, Rokoko) - large pink blooms with very low, arching branches; repeat bloomer; groundcover; grows to 2' tall
Snow Pavement	Snow Pavement (aka: Schneekoppe) - white with mauve pink tinge; red rose hips in autumn; very hardy; grows to to 2.5'; groundcover; repeat bloomer
Dwarf Pavement	Fragrant , pink flowers. Shorter stature, approximately 3' at maturity
