

Species: Rubus occidentalis

(rue'bus ok-sih-den-ta'lis)

Blackcap Raspberry

Cultivar Information

The few straight cultivars of this species are listed below. That said there are many hybrids of this species with R. idaeus. Essentially any of the agriculturally planted black or purple raspberries on the market have R. occidentalis as a parent. This plant is an aggressive native that produces delicious black fruits and is not susceptible to juglone (a growth inhibitor produced by Juglans species) unlike red raspberries.

Cultivar Name	Notes
Bristol	'Bristol' - mid-season producer; excellent flavor; one berry crop each year is produced in early summer
Munger	'Munger' - fewer seeds than species; large, firm, juicy fruits; fruits ripen in August (later than species); self-pollinating
Jewel	'Jewel' - vigorous and erect form; large fruits with excellent flavor; fruits ripen early; canes are purplish red
