



Species: *Viburnum acerifolium*

(vye-bur'num a-ser-i-fo'lee-um)

Maple-leaved Viburnum

Ornamental Characteristics

Size: Shrub 4 to 8 feet

Height: 4' - 6' (spread 3' - 4')

Leaves: Deciduous

Shape: sparsely branched shrub

Ornamental Other: extremely shade tolerant □ Does not tolerate full sun

Environmental Characteristics

Light: Part shade, Shade

Hardy To Zone: 4a

Soil Ph: Requires acid (pH 5.0 to 7.0)

Environmental Other: fall foliage outstanding pinkish red to light red-purple; white flower clusters in June; shiny black fruit in September persist into winter

Insect Disease

Moderately susceptible to V. Leaf Beetle
