Duflon	'Duflon' - micro-mini; extremely slow-growing, puts on less than ½ inch of new growth per year
Glauca Compacta	'Glauca Compacta'- glaucous; pyramidal semi-dwarf; 3 to 4 ft. tall in 10 years, ultimately 6 to 8 ft. tall, 5 to 6 ft. wide
var. arizonica	var. arizonica - glaucous foliage
