Size: Shrub < 4 feet Height: 2'-3' Leaves: Evergreen Shape: rounded Ornamental Other: Winter burn of foliage when grown in the sun during a very cold winter.

Cultivar Name	Notes
Rubella	'Rubella' - male variety; with dark-green leaves edged in red; reddish flower buds
subsp. reevesiana	subsp. reevesiana - hermaphroditic subspecies that bears both male and female flowers and as a result fruits
Wakehurst White	'Wakehurst White' (a.k.a. 'Fructo Alba') - white fruits
Redruth	'Redruth' - hermaphroditic, profusely fruiting
Bronze Knight	'Bronze Knight' - foliage takes on a bronze hue in winter; male cultivar that produces no fruit
Bowles Dwarf Male	'Bowles Dwarf Male' - dwarf, compact form; non-fruiting male clone; grows to 1' tall x 1.5 wide
Bowles Dwarf Female	'Bowles Dwarf Female' - dwarf, compact form; fruiting female clone; grows to 1' tall x 1.5 wide
