(el-ee-ag'nus an-gus-ti-fo'lee-ah)

### Russian Olive

#### **Cultivar Information**

An invasive plant with no known sterile varieties, superior fruiting varieties are known in Europe and Asia but not commonly found in the US.

#### **Crnamental Characteristics**

Size: Tree > 30 feet

Height: 12' - 15'(20') (equal spread)

Leaves: Deciduous

Shape: oval-rounded, loose and open

Ornamental Other: prefers sun and open conditions; adaptable to any soil but prefers light, sandy

loam; fixes atmospheric nitrogen

### **Environmental Characteristics**

Light: Full sun Hardy To Zone: 3a

Soil Ph: Can tolerate acid to alkaline soil (pH 5.0 to 8.0) Salt Tolerance: Tolerates salt spray, Tolerates salty soil

Environmental Other: silvery gray foliage holds late into fall; fruit and flowers not very noticeable among leaves; rich brown, shedding bark, grows best if cut back every few years and coppiced.
