#### Ornamental Characteristics

Size: Tree > 30 feet

Height: 45' - 75'

Leaves: Evergreen

Shape: narrowly conical

Light: Full sun, Part shade

Hardy To Zone: 3a

Soil Ph: Can tolerate acid to alkaline soil (pH 5.0 to 8.0)

Environmental Other: full sun for best growth but will tolerate light shade; will not withstand polluted areas or heat

## Cultivars for *Abies balsamea*

Cultivar Name	Notes
Hudsonia	flat-topped dwarf to 20cm in 10 years
Jamy	miniature (extreme dwarf); needles emerge light-green in spring and darken through the season; downward curving needles
Piccolo	Dense, globe-shaped dwarf; superior habit to 'Nana'
Nana	rounded dwarf to 2 feet tall and 3 feet wide
Verkade's Prostrate	Dwarf; lime green new growth in spring; grows to approx. 20cm x 60cm
