



Species: *Acer pensylvanicum*

(ay'ser pen-sil-vay'ni-kum)

Striped Maple; Moosewood

Ornamental Characteristics

Size: Tree < 30 feet

Height: 15 - 20'(30') (spread: equal or less)

Leaves: Deciduous

Shape: large shrub or small tree; arching branches and flat or rounded crown

Ornamental Other: Grows best in at least part shade, in its native range it is an understory plant.

Greenish bark on younger plants is variable striped with white. Bark is generally quite ornamental.

Large leaves are somewhat unique and can be attractively pal to golden yellow depending on exposure to direct sunlight, come fall.

Environmental Characteristics

Light: Part shade, Shade

Hardy To Zone: 3b

Soil Ph: Can tolerate acid to neutral soil (pH 5.0 to 7.4)

Environmental Other: small yellow pendulous flowers in late spring; coarse foliage emerges pale green changing to med. green in summer to yellow in fall; young branches have longitudinally striped white and green bark

Insect Disease

Relatively trouble-free if sited properly, requiring little to no maintenance. Susceptible to canker under stress. Bark is thin and subject to mower damage.

Cultivar Name	Notes
Erythrocladum	'Erythrocladum' - bright red twigs in winter; seldom available
Silver Vein	'Silver Vein' - silver striations on bark
White Tigress	'White Tigress' - more heat tolerant
