

# Species: Lonicera tatarica

(lon-iss'er-ah tah-tare'i-kah)

Tatarian Honeysuckle

#### **Cultivar Information**

This species is seriously invasive almost anywhere in the United States, therefore it generally should not be planted. That said some cultivars do exist.

#### **C**rnamental Characteristics

Size: Shrub > 8 feet
Height: 10' - 12' (spread 10' - 12')
Leaves: Deciduous
Shape: upright oval to rounded shrub
Ornamental Other: seeds profusely invasive

Environmental Characteristics

Light: Full sun, Part shade, Shade

Hardy To Zone: 3b

Soil Ph: Can tolerate acid to alkaline soil (pH 5.0 to 8.0)

Environmental Other: leafs out very early in spring; white to pink flowers in May; red fruit appears in July

Cultivar Name	Notes
Alba	'Alba' - pure white flowers; otherwise similar to species
Arnold Red	'Arnold Red' - dark red flowers; resistant to Russian aphid
Freedom	'Freedom' (possibly a selection or cultivar of L. korolkowii) - blue-green leaves; white flowers tinged with pink; red fruit; resistant to the Russian aphid
Lutea	'Lutea' - pink flowers; yellow fruit
Nana	'Nana' - dwarf form; grows to 3' tall; pink flowers
Rosea	'Rosea' - flowers rose on the outside and pink on the inside
