#### Ornamental Characteristics

Size: Vine

Height: 30' - 50'+

Leaves: Deciduous

Shape: clinging vine or ground over

Ornamental Other: tolerant of most soils; full sun to full shade;

#### Environmental Characteristics

Light: Full sun, Part shade, Shade

Hardy To Zone: 3b

Soil Ph: Can tolerate acid to alkaline soil (pH 5.0 to 8.0)

Environmental Other: deciduous; leaves emerge bronze/red, turn green then crimson/purple/red in fall; small blue-black fruits; tough, low-maintenance vine

#### Insect Disease

relatively trouble free; possible problems are canker, downy mildew, leaf spots, powdery mildew, wilt, beetles, leaf hoppers, scales and others

Cultivar Name	Notes
Dark Green Ice	'Dark Green Ice' - glossy, dark green foliage
var. engelmannii	var. engelmannii - smaller leaflets
var. hirsuta	var. hirsuta - pubescent leaves
var. saint-paulii	var. saint-paulii - smaller leaflets; better clinging
Star Showers	Star Showers (a.k.a. 'Monham', 'Variegata') - variegated with sectors of white, cream and green, foliage can also have a pinkish cast; not as vigorous as the species
Red Wall	'Red Wall' (a.k.a. 'Troki') - new foliage bronze, matures to dark green, and finally turns an extremely showy fire-engine red in fall
Yellow Wall	'Yellow Wall' - notable due to solid yellow fall foliage
