Over 130 named cultivars which vary according to flower color and mildew resistance; below are a few of the most noteworthy.

Crnamental Characteristics

Size: Shrub < 4 feet

Height: 3' - 4' (spread 8')

Leaves: Deciduous

Shape: rounded, dense, multi-stem

Ornamental Other: Will tolerate cold climates; not as drought tolerant as thought

Environmental Characteristics

Light: Full sun Hardy To Zone: 3a

Soil Ph: Can tolerate acid to alkaline soil (pH 5.0 to 8.0)

Environmental Other: bright yellow flowers bloom all summer and into fall; capsules persist at twig

tips; twigs attract deer

Insect Disease

susceptible to powdery mildew

Notes
'Elizabeth' - yellow flowering
'Goldfinger' - deep yellow flowers
'Longacre' - possibly the most mildew resistant cultivar, yellow flowers
'McKay's White' - creamy white flowers
'Marob' - bright red flowers
'Abbotswood' - prolific white flowers; bluish foliage
'Abbotswood Silver' - same as above but with white variegated leaves
'Gold Drop' - rounded plant to 3 feet; yellow flowers; long-blooming
'Pink Beauty' - clear pink blossoms, semi-dwarf to 2 feet
'Snowbird' - white blossoms; double-flowering; lustrous foliage
'Mango Tango' - bicolor flowers; orange-red radiating to yellow
'Red Robin' - red flowers that fade slightly to orange
'Sundance' - double, yellow flowers
'Yellow Gem' - yellow flowers with ruffled petals
