Ornamental Characteristics

Size: Tree > 30 feet

Height: 40' - 80'

Leaves: Evergreen

Shape: openly pyramidal

Cultivar Name	Notes
Aurea	'Aurea' - upright pyramid; golden-tipped foliage; 4' in 10 years
Blue	'Blue' - broad upright; striking blue foliage
Graceful Grace	'Graceful Grace' - compact weeping form; dark-green needles with a glaucous cast
Emerald Twist	'Emerald Twist'(a.k.a. 'Torquis') - broad upright form; twisting, undulating branches; dark-green needles
Waggin' Tails	'Waggin' Tails' - broad upright; dark green; branches curve and twist like the wagging tail of a dog; slower growth
var. glauca	var. glauca - bluish-green needles; more compact; upright branching
Fastigiata	'Fastigiata' - branches that are distinctly upright; dense, green-gray needles
Fletcheri	'Fletcheri' - dwarf form; grows to 3 - 6' tall x 3' wide; blue-green needles
Graceful Grace	'Graceful Grace' - fine weeping form; longer needles; upright plant; gracefully-drooping, lax branches
Loggerhead	'Loggerhead' - dense, spreading, mounded habit; similar to "Bird's Nest Spruce" (<i>Picea abies</i> 'Nidiformis')
Little Jon	'Little Jon' - globular multi-stemmed dwarf form, become more broad and tall with age dark green needles
Hillside Pride	'Hillside Pride' - similar to 'Little Jon'; plant with upright branching
Pendula	'Pendula' - main trunk that twists as it grows upwards; lateral branches are spreading and droop for a mounded effect; deep green needles
Carnefix Weeping	'Carnefix Weeping' - variable upright habit; pendulous branches; rich green needles
Compact	'Compacta' - dwarf, very compact, low spreading form; short, rich glossy-green needles; can be staked to form a plump pyramid; if staked grows to 3' tall x 2' wide in 10 years
Cross Selection	'Cross Selection' - upright, pyramidal form; short needles are blue-gray with a "glowing" quality; grows to 6' tall x 3' wide in 10 years
De Bunn	'De Bunn' - bun-shaped when young, eventually a conical dwarf form; rich green needles; grows to 18" tall x 14" wide in 10 years

Cultivar Name	Notes
Hale	'Hale' - slow-growing, flattened-globose form; short, bright glossy-green needles; 2' tall x 2.5' wide in 10 years
Hillside Gold	'Hillside Gold' - upright pyramidal form; glossy green needles turn to gold in winter, new growth in spring has a contrasting chartreuse color; grows to 5' tall x 3' wide in 10 years
Jackson's Witch's Broom	'Jackson's Witch's Broom' -miniature flattened-globe form; bright-green glossy needles; grows to 10" tall x 12" wide in 10 years
Seattle Mountain	'Seattle Mountain' - compact, upright form; lemon-yellow foliage will be light green in deep shade; grow to 5' tall x 3' wide in 10 years
Shorty's Blue	'Shorty's Blue' - upright, compact, pyramidal form; rich blue foliage; grows to 7' tall x 3.5' wide in 10 years
Skyline	'Skyline' - upright for; narrow whipcord-like branches; foliage is gray blue-green; grows to 8' tall x 3' wide in 10 years
