### Ural False Spirea

#### Cultivar Information

This hardy, attractive plant can be aggressive to invasive through vegetative propagation.

#### Ornamental Characteristics

Size: Shrub > 8 feet

Height: 5' - 10' (spread 5' - 10')

Leaves: Deciduous

Shape: multistemmed shrub

Ornamental Other: full sun to half shade

#### Environmental Characteristics

Light: Full sun, Part shade

Hardy To Zone: 3a

Soil Ph: Can tolerate acid to alkaline soil (pH 5.0 to 8.0)

Environmental Other: white flowers appear in large pyramidal panicles in late July; new foliage has a reddish tinge and matures to deep green

occasional mite infestations

native to northern Asia (Ural to Japan); transplants readily ; one of the first plants to leaf out in spring; spreading and vigorous; a good bank stabilizer. Difficult to contain unless there is a physical barrier.
