Size: Shrub 4 to 8 feet

Height: 8' - 10' (spread slightly greater)

Cultivars for Viburnum plicatum f. tomentosum

Cultivar Name	Notes
Mariesii	'Mariesii' - old selection of var. tomentosum; distinctly layered horizontal branches; large, white sterile blooms, raised on longer stem; superior fruit set; deep red fall foliage; grows to to 10' tall
Shasta	'Shasta' - spreading, layered horizontal branches; profuse clusters of pure white flowers; red-black fruit; should not be pruned; grows to 10' tall to wider
Shoshoni	'Shoshoni' - 'Shasta' form at a smaller scale
plicatum	V. plicatum - shows round white flowers; does not show horizontal growth habit
Fireworks	'Fireworks' - large flower clusters; persistent red pedicels (flower stalks) that lend added interest; grows to 8 - 12' tall
Pink Sensation	'Pink Sensation' (a.k.a. 'Roseace' and 'Kern's Pink'); - old V. plicatum-form; round heads of variably pinkish flowers; grows to 10' tall
Mary Milton	'Mary Milton' (a.k.a. 'Mary Melton') - similar to 'Pink Sensation'
Leach's Compacta	'Leach's Compacta' - V. plicatum variant; compact, dense habit; white "snowball" flower clusters; reddish fall color; grows to 4' tall and wide
Newport	'Newport' (a.k.a. 'Newzam', 'Nanum Newport') - older V. plicatum variant; dense, compact dwarf form; white "snowball"-type flower clusters; good red fall color; rarely fruits; grows to 4' tall x 6' wide
Triumph	'Triumph' (a.k.a. 'Trizam') - selected from 'Newport'; similar in most regards
Pink Beauty	'Pink Beauty' - flowers with variable light pink petals or white petals edged in pink; smaller habit than species, profuse red fruits
Popcorn	'Popcorn' - V. plicatum variant; rounded clusters of pure white flowers; that apparently resemble popcorn to some degree; smaller than species; sporadic production of red fruit; grows to 8' tall
Shasta Variegated	'Shasta Variegated' similar to 'Shasta'; leaves variegated with a yellowish-green margin
Shoshoni	'Shoshoni' - variant of 'Shasta', similar but on a much smaller scale; dense, compact form; grows wider than tall to 5' high x 8' wide

Cultivar Name	Notes
Summer Snowflake	'Summer Snowflake' (a.k.a. 'Fujisanensis', 'Everblooming', 'Nanum Semperflorens', 'Nanum', 'Watanabei', 'Watanabe') - by most accounts, these cultivars all seem to refer to the same plant; compact form; white blooms produced continuously from May to mid-November; fruit set sporadic and inconsistent; reddish fall color; grows to 6' tall or slightly more
Cascade	'Cascade' - wide-spreading horizontal branches; umbrella-shaped flower colors, large sterile outer flowers appearing to cascade; showy red fruit; grows to 10° tall and to 12° wide
Copper Ridges	'Copper Ridges' - dome shaped, compact shrub; dense, spreading branche; heavily textured new leaves emerge with a copper tint; 2-3" clusters of white flowers; scarlet red fruits mature to black; copper to dark maroon fall foliage
Dart's Red Robin	'Dart's Red Robin' - broad spreading form; profuse white tinged pink flowers in umbrella-shaped inflorescences; deep red fruits; grows to 8' tall x $10'$ wide
Grandiflorum	'Grandiflorum' - more tiered habit than species; white snowball flowers are larger and appear earlier than other f. plicatum, can be flushed with pink or a hint of apricot; leaves are wider and more rounded, veins tinted red on the underside; grows to 8-10' tall
Igloo	'Igloo' - wide-spreading, compact, dome-shaped, full, dense form; white 4" lacecap flower clusters; good quantities of scarlet-red fruit; grows from 6 - 8' tall x 10' wide
Kilimanjaro	'Kilimanjaro' - upright, narrow, pyramidal form; flat clusters of pure white flowers; bright pinkish/red berries; dark green foliage turns dark red in autumn; grows 8 - 10 ' tall x 3 - 5 ' wide
St. Keverne	'St. Keverne' - upright form; horizontally tiered habit; flat-topped to umbrella shaped flower clusters, sterile outer ring of white flowers with petals that curve upward; sparse, small, red fruits; deeply furrowed green foliage, turns purplered in fall; grows to 10-12' tall
Lanarth	'Lanarth' - similar to 'Mariesii'; somewhat larger habit; larger creamy-white sterile flowers; branches in tiered layers, not quite as horizontal as 'Mariesii'; red fruit and fall color; grows to 10' tall and wide
Molly Schroeder	'Molly Schroeder' - horizontal branching; Inflorescence consists of an outer ring of sterile pink flowers with creamy-white veination with a darker cream throat, consistantly pink from year to year; re-blooms fairly consistently in summer; grows to 8' tall x 5' wide
