Ornamental Characteristics

Size: Tree > 30 feet

Height: 30' - 40' (spread 20' - 25')

Leaves: Evergreen

Shape: pyramidal with horizontal stiff branches

Light: Full sun, Part shade

Hardy To Zone: 4a

Soil Ph: Can tolerate acid to alkaline soil (pH 5.0 to 8.0)

Environmental Other: sun or part-shade; suffers in hot, dry weather

Cultivar Name	Notes
Caanan Fir	'Caanan Fir' - a naturally occurring hybrid between Balsam and Fraser Fir commonly found in Christmas tree plantations
Fastigiata Compacta	'Fastigiata Compacta' - compact and columnar; semi-dwarf 6' tall by 2' wide in 10 years
Klein's Nest	'Klein's Nest' - dense, compact form; to 30"
Prostrata	'Prostrata' - slow-growing; spreading; to 4-5'
