### **C**rnamental Characteristics

Size: Tree < 30 feet</li>
Height: 15' - 20' (equal spread)
Leaves: Deciduous
Shape: stiffly upright and pyramidal
Ornamental Other: does well in full sun but needs part shade in areas with hot summers

#### **Environmental Characteristics**

Light: Full sun, Part shade

Hardy To Zone: 5b

Soil Ph: Can tolerate acid to neutral soil (pH 5.0 to 7.4)

Environmental Other: interesting but inconspicuous dark red flowers in mid-spring; distinctive green drooping foliage turns bright yellow in fall; edible green to yellow-brown fragrant fruit in autumn

native to the eastern US; transplant as small B & B or container plant; spreads by suckers to form a 'pawpaw patch'; at least two clones necessary for cross-pollination and good fruiting

Cultivar Name	Notes
Overleese	'Overleese' - fruits up to one lb or more
Mitchell	'Mitchell' - large fruit; excellent quality
Wilson	'Wilson' - flavorful, sweet, yellow fruit
Mary Foo	'Mary Foo's Johnson' - similar to 'Sunflower'
Sunflower	'Sunflower' - large fruit; butter colored flesh; few seeds
Uncle Tom	'Uncle Tom' - probably the first named variety on record; first grown around 1896
