Crnamental Characteristics

Size: Shrub > 8 feet
Height: 6' - 9' (6' - 12' spread)
Leaves: Deciduous
Shape: Large branching that may arch in shadier sites
Ornamental Other: shade or sun

Environmental Characteristics

Light: Full sun, Part shade Hardy To Zone: 4a Soil Ph: Can tolerate acid to alkaline soil (pH 5.0 to 8.0) Environmental Other: very fragrant but not conspicuous dark red-brown flowers in May; shiny, dark green leaves turn yellow in fall; fruit persists into winter

very resistant; maintenance and problem free

Aphrodite	'Aphrodite' - large, bright red, fragrant magnolia-like flowers; rebloomer
Athens	'Athens' (a.k.a. 'Katherine') - tremendous fragrance, yellow flowers
Edith Wilder	'Edith Wilder' - exceptional fragrance and fall color
Hartlage Wine	'Hartlage Wine' - large purple flowers
Luslawice	'Luslawice' - lighter color flowers
Margarita	'Margarita' - yellow flowers
Michael Lindsey	'Michael Lindsey' - fragrant, beautiful color
Purpureus	'Purpureus' - purplish leaves
Towe	'Towe' - yellow flowers, not fragrant
Urbana	'Urbana' - sweet fragrance
Venus	'Venus' - fragrant white flowers with yellow and purple centers
