Cultivar Information

Cultivation of C. orbiculatus is inadvisable due to it's extremely invasive tendencies throughout much of its range. That said the native C. scandens makes an excellent non-invasive alternative.

Crnamental Characteristics

Size: Vine

Height: 33' - 40'

Leaves: Deciduous
Shape: spread (vine)

Ornamental Other: less cold-hardy than the native C. scandens; fast growing and invasive

Environmental Characteristics

Light: Full sun, Part shade

Hardy To Zone: 5a

Soil Ph: Can tolerate acid to alkaline soil (pH 5.0 to 8.0)

Environmental Other: orange and red fruits are in lateral clusters
