There are many cultivars and varieties of this species. Due to the extreme pest and disease issues associated with this plant, cultivar selection is of particular importance. Crosses with C. kousa have produced unique plants with disease resistance, see C. kousa for these cultivars.

Shape: rounded to flat-topped, with horizontal, spreading branches

Cultivar Name	Notes
Cherokee Chief	'Cherokee Chief' - deep red bracts, good powdery mildew resistance
Cherokee Princess	'Cherokee Princess' - large white bracts; good powdery mildew resistance; improved hardiness
Cloud Nine	'Cloud Nine' - hardy; profuse flowering
First Lady	'First Lady' - variegated foliage; white flowers; poor disease resistance
Pluribracteata	'Pluribracteata' - double white flowers open late
Rubra	'Rubra' - pink flowers
Cherokee Brave	'Cherokee Brave' - Considered one of the best red forms, with deep pink bracts that have a white center; marked powdery mildew resistance
Weaver's White	'Weaver's White' - white flowers; good powdery mildew resistance
Cherokee Sunset	'Cherokee Sunset' - variegated dogwood with red flower bracts; pink-tipped new growth matures to a colorful combination of green and yellow, turning in the fall to a bright combination of pink, reds and purple; good powdery mildew and anthracnose resistance
Welch's Bay Beauty	'Welch's Bay Beauty' - double, gardenia-like flower that are almost 5 inches wide; horizontal to upright branching; white to pink spring flowers; good powdery mildew resistance
Appalachian Spring	'Appalachian Spring' - white flowers, marked anthracnose resistance
